Lindsay Simourd

“My master's thesis research used an experimental psychopathology approach to explore how changing the way we measure neurocognition might offer new insight into the experience of completing a neurocognitive task for individuals with depression. Data collection is ongoing, but preliminary evidence highlights the complexity of measuring neurocognition in depression and supports the utility of designing alternative measurement approaches. This was a very rewarding experience, and I am grateful to my incredible supervisor and lab team for their support of this work.”

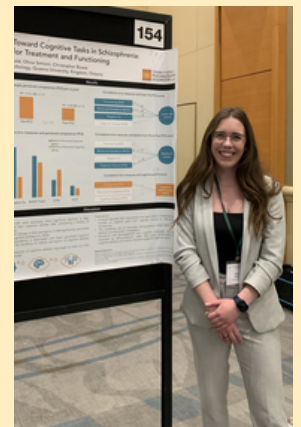
Collaborating Across Canada
